Winter Car Care Kit

Antifreeze – Keep your fluid levels full to help regulate your car's temperature.

Blankets – Stay warm and pack a blanket for those just-in-case situations.

Duct tape – Patch and temporarily repair with heavy-duty duct tape.

Extra clothes – Pack a change of clothes and sturdy boots for those just-in-case situations.

Fire extinguisher – Keep a fire extinguisher in the car in case of a fire.

First-aid supplies – Don't forget bandages, gauze, skin ointments, etc.

Flashlights – A flashlight is especially helpful to have on hand in any situation. Don't forget the extra batteries.

Gloves – Protect your hands from the elements when you're stranded.

Ice scraper – Use this to clear the windshield and windows of snow and ice. **LED flares** – Snow flurries can obstruct views even when light outside, and a bright flare can help keep you safe if you pull over or get stuck.

Microfiber cloths – Have cloths or absorbent towels for cleanup as needed.

Portable jump starter/air compressor unit – For those just-in-case situations when you need a jump-start or to put air in your tires.

Portable phone charger -

In case you need to call for help, always have a way to power up your mobile device.

Sand or kitty litter for traction – Use these to give your vehicle traction when stuck.

Shovel – Use a small shovel to clear a path and help dig out of mushy ditches.

Snacks – Have small food items stocked to keep hunger at bay while waiting for help.

Snow brush – Make sure your view of the road is unobstructed, and remove snow from the car hood, roof, and trunk lid.

Snow chains or other traction devices - Get

through the worst of conditions with snow chains or other devices that help with traction.

Tire pressure gauge -

Check your tire pressure levels often because cold weather can adversely affect your tire pressure.

Tool kit – Pack a basic tool kit to troubleshoot when needed.

Water – Keep fresh bottled water on hand for drinking and other purposes in and around the vehicle.
